







GROWTH TRENDS CONTINUE THROUGH THE SUMMER

- Capacity growth looks set to continue the trend of recent months, sitting 3.7% above the pre pandemic period
- Domestic capacity is expected to grow at 3.1% this summer on last year and is trending at 4.7% ahead of 2019
- International is also ahead of 2019, by 2.3% and up 11.6% on 2023







THE WORLD'S LONGEST ROUTES

- The 10 longest flights in the world all cover distances of over 14,000km, and all take between 16-18 hours.
- The longest flight, between JFK and SIN, flies just over a third of the way round the world. It operates with two full crews, and they have three days off before the return leg to recover.
- 6 of the longest routes start or end in Australia and New Zealand, facilitating connectivity at opposite ends of the world.
- New this summer, China's longest route operated by China Southern connects Shenzhen and Mexico City directly for the first time. The route only operates direct on the way however, as the altitude at Mexico City means a fuel stop at Tijuana is needed on the return leg.

THE DATA BEHIND THE LONGEST ROUTES





Indirect Pax


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- Typically these ultra long haul flights have an element of connecting passengers whose journeys originate behind or beyond the route's origin point.
- LHR-PER has the highest share of direct passengers with 61% travelling from London to Perth, and 55% the other way.

TOP 10 LONGEST SINGLE AISLE AIRCRAFT ROUTES...

- The longest single aisle aircraft routes currently operate at a range of between 6,000-6,500km and predominantly on transatlantic routes on smaller, secondary routes.
- Narrowbodies have operated on the transatlantic for a number of years, and still do – United operate a 757-200 on their Stockholm – Newark route this summer
- Three of the Top 10 longest single aisle routes operate between the USA and Latin America


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




UNSERVED DESTINATIONS IN A321 XLR RANGE

- There are 496 A321-XLRs on order, with the first deliveries due to begin later this year to IAG who plan to deploy them on Iberia routes, on Madrid Boston, and to Washington allowing it to operate year round from a seasonal operation currently.
- The Iberia A321-XLRS will have 182 seats and two cabins but no premium economy








AND THE SHORTEST WIDEBODY ROUTES...

- In the Middle East, 10% of flights under a distance of 1000km are operated by widebody aircraft. In North East Asia the share is 6.8%.
- Japan dominates in the use of widebodies on short sectors, with 6 of the top 10 widebody routes globally by the number of flights operating short domestic sectors – interesting when you consider Japan also has an extensive high speed rail network! Averaging just 400 miles for each route and 1 h 30 of flying time, they offer a competitive alternative to rail, and allow frequent flyers to collect loyalty points.
- Almost all of the Top 10 widebody routes operate within Asia, with one exception – the key Saudi domestic trunk route between Jeddah and Rivadh - where Saudia operate a mix of Airbus A330s, Boeing 777's and some B787-900s, averaging 335 seats per widebody movement
- In Japan the Boeing 767 and 787 are most popular accounting for 38% and 35% of widebody capacity on domestic routes.



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

(787 and A350 routes shorter than 1,000 nautical miles, June 2024 schedule)




MOST SEATS ON THE AIRCRAFT

- The A380 is the largest passenger aircraft in service
- 10 carriers currently have A380's in operation with seat configurations ranging from Korean Air with 470 seats to ANA squeezing in the most with 520. The average is 499 with Asiana sitting right at the midpoint.
- There are currently 217 A380's in the global fleet, with 145 of these in active use. 24 are out for maintenance and 48 are in storage.
- Emirates have the second highest seat density on the A380 with an average of 518 seats although across the fleet they have 7 different configurations ranging from 484 to 615. Emirates have 12 A380's with the 615 configuration 557 seats in economy and 58 in business.
- This week these Emirates high gauge A380s are operating on 10 routes across their network












FIFTH FREEDOMS – HOW, WHY AND WHERE?

- There are 180 fifth freedom routes that operated in 2023 across various countries and continents.
- Fifth freedom routes are those where a carrier operates between two countries that are not their domicile country

Fifth Freedom routes by carrier - 2023








ROUTES WITH MOST STOPS



WHERE IS EVERYONE GOING THIS SUMMER?

- The new Tulum airport in the Yucatan Peninsula, south of Cancun in Mexico means the USA-Mexico tops the list of the country pairs with most new routes this summer. There are 18 new routes between the USA and Mexico, with 9 of those operating to Tulum from points across the US. Monterrey is also popular, with three new routes there from Orlando. Denver and Miami.
- France Italy sees the next highest increase in new routes this summer, with 13 routes added. Both Ryanair and Volotea are driving growth - Ryanair from Beauvais to points across Italy including Rome, Catania in Sicily, and Olbia in Sardinia, whilst Volotea are adding capacity between Bordeaux and Brest to Palermo, Trieste, Verona and Olbia
- Italy is also experiencing new route growth from Germany and Spain.
- There is also ongoing recovery taking place in Asia where routes between China and Thailand, South Korea and Japan are coming back this summer for the first time since 2019.




Country Pairs with the most





WHO IS SITTING WHERE?

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Over the last decade and especially since the pandemic we've seen a shift from first to business. This is most evident in North America, although in percentage terms fairly small with a shift of 2.2% to 0.7% in first class share of capacity. This equates to a reduction of 1.1m seats







CARGO ... FLOWERS, FISH AND SHELLFISH ARE IMPORTANT!

- Live lobsters! 16,000 Tonnes exported from Halifax St Johns in 2022 valued at US\$293 million. Major destinations included China and Europe.
- Circa 90% of the world's asparagus produced in Peru 97,000 Tonnes valued at US\$382 million of which the USA (72,000) and Spain (10,000) were major markets.
- Security of aviation safer than trucking
- US express carriers Fedex "position" up to six aircraft a night waiting for confirmation of where additional capacity required and move accordingly
- LAN send an aircraft north with live salmon from Santiago and once they know what the spot price is of flowers v asparagus they select the product that generates the best return


